The Berkman Klein Center and MIT Media Lab are looking for a cohort of professionals to join their 2019 Assembly Cohort. [Assembly](#), beginning March 11, 2019 and ending June 15, 2019, “will challenge Assemblers to confront emerging problems related to the ethics and governance of artificial intelligence.”

Application deadline: September 2, 2018.

Assembly gathers a small cohort of technologists, managers, policymakers, and other professionals to confront emerging problems related to the ethics and governance of artificial intelligence. Over four months, participants engage in a design-thinking process, a course led by Harvard and MIT faculty, and a collaborative development period to explore hard problems with running code. The cohort will divide into teams to create actionable projects that address real-world problems, either as part of ongoing Initiative work or as part of a new Assembly project. For example, last year, teams built a prototype to circumvent facial recognition systems using adversarial attacks, developed a playbook for cities interested in purchasing or developing AI systems, and created a prototype of a dataset “nutrition label”, among other projects.
