Coronavirus modelers factor in new public health risk: Accusations their work is a hoax | Washington Post

In the one month since the first U.S. <u>coronavirus</u> death, America has become a country of uncertainty.

New cases of infection and casualties <u>continue multiplying</u>. New York and Louisiana hospitals are grappling with a flood of patients that threatens to overwhelm their health-care systems. Meanwhile, the president and political conservatives are increasingly agitating to <u>end drastic restrictions</u> meant to buy time and save lives.

Running beneath it all, in a continuous loop through our national psyche, are basic questions leaders are struggling to answer: When can we <u>safely lift these</u> <u>quarantines</u>? How many people could die if we do it too early? Just <u>how</u> <u>dangerous</u> will this pandemic turn out to be? And what exactly <u>should be our next</u> <u>step</u>?
