Is RT's international audience real?

That's an important question, as <u>regulators and distributors debate</u> where the Kremlin-backed network falls on the spectrum from news channel to state propaganda. All across the world, RT is being <u>tossed off cable systems</u>, <u>blocked by</u> <u>ad networks</u>, <u>removed from app stores</u>, <u>downranked in search engines</u>, or <u>banned</u> <u>outright</u>.

But the level of concern would seem inextricably linked to the size of RT's reach; propaganda isn't particularly effective if no one sees it. Is it a <u>rising power</u> in <u>an</u> <u>information war</u>, or a <u>waste of Kremlin cash</u> that <u>fakes its own numbers</u>?
