

Nearly half of survey respondents believe vaccine misinformation | The Media School at Indiana University Bloomington

Almost 50% of respondents to a recent Indiana University survey believe it is definitely or likely true that the Centers for Disease Control is hiding negative effects from COVID-19 vaccines, and close to 25% believe the vaccines cause infertility in women.

These beliefs are tied strongly to respondents' political leanings, with more Republicans than Democrats saying they believe the false statements about the vaccine.
