Taiwan election: Tsai Ing-wen faces homophobic fake news | Quartz

Taiwan is often described as Asia's most gay-friendly place. It was, after all, the first country in Asia to legalize same-sex marriage. It boasts the biggest <u>Pride</u> <u>event</u> in the region and has a <u>vibrant "pink" economy</u>.

It's clear, however, that nearly eight months after same-sex marriage <u>became</u> <u>legal</u>, many in Taiwan remain deeply opposed to the law that grants "two persons of the same gender" the right to create a "permanent union." Ahead of Saturday's (Jan. 11) presidential and legislative elections, opponents of president Tsai Ing-wen are campaigning against her support for LGBT rights. Tsai publicly backed the law, tweeting #LoveWins the day it passed.
