## The COVID-19 'infodemic': what does the misinformation landscape look like and how can we respond? | Oxford Martin School

> In mid-February, the <u>World Health Organization announced</u> that the new coronavirus pandemic was accompanied by an 'infodemic' of misinformation. Cristina Tardáguila, Associate Director of the <u>International Fact-checking Network</u> (IFCN), has <u>called</u> COVID-19<u>'the biggest challenge fact-checkers have ever faced.'</u>

> In the face of this, research from <u>the Oxford Martin Programme on Misinformation</u>, <u>Science and Media</u> showed a significant and rapid response from independent factcheckers. According to their sample, the number of English-language fact-checks rose more than 900% from January to March. They believe that the total volume has grown even faster.
