The Supreme Court just legalized stalking | Slate

> The Supreme Court majority describes its <u>holding</u> last week in *Counterman v. Colorado* as a vindication of the First Amendment and a principled defense of free speech. Indeed, influential civil libertarian organizations were quick to <u>celebrate</u> the decision. ACLU attorney Brian Hauss <u>praised</u> the court for guaranteeing that "inadvertently threatening speech cannot be criminalized" and for "provid[ing] essential breathing room for public debate." Foundation for Individual Rights and Expression (FIRE) attorney Jay Diaz <u>rejoiced</u> that "fewer prosecutors will be able to criminalize speech tomorrow than was possible yesterday" and praised the majority for "ensur[ing] that Americans would not face prosecution for parody or political commentary."
