Why Telegram — despite being rife with Russian disinformation — became the go-to app for Ukrainians | Nieman Journalism Lab

For weeks, Russia's military assault on Ukraine has been complemented by full-fledged information warfare. The Kremlin has propagandized Russian state media, and is trying to control the narrative online too.

We've seen a bombardment of "imposter content" circulating — including fake news reports and deepfake videos – while Ukrainians and the rest of the world have scrambled to find ways to tell the real story of the invasion.
